Our **Successful Students Impact Area** provides reading and math proficiency programs, reengages opportunity youth, provides youth support services for vulnerable populations, hosts transition camps for students entering middle or high school and advocates for disciplinary referral reform to help students reach their full potential.

Together, we are working to:

- Increase reading proficiency by the end of third grade
- Increase eighth grade math proficiency
- Decrease the number of opportunity youth, ages 16 - 24
- Decrease chronic absenteeism
- Decrease the number of disciplinary/behavioral referrals
